Objectives of EU Transport Policy in a Nutshell

- •A transport system that meets the demand of citizens and businesses for mobility and transport
- •A transport system that can foster a (balanced) economic development of the Union and its regions; European integration and territorial cohesion; and the functioning of the single market (against the background of EU enlargement and globalisation)
- •A transport system that is more efficient (closing bottlenecks and gaps; inter-modality; ITS/ICT) and more sustainable (less dependent on fossil fuels; less adverse impacts on environment, climate, human health)



Delivering the EU transport policy through ...

- Non-legislative action, e.g.
 - **Transport White Paper (2011)** "Roadmap to a Single European Transport Area Towards a competitive and resource efficient transport system"
 - Communication (2013) "Together towards competitive and resource efficient urban mobility"
- Legislative action, e.g.
- Common rules, e.g. pollutant emissions EURO standards and CO2 limits for vehicles; fuel quality and renewable energy; air quality; Directive for the deployment of alternative fuels infrastucture-2014 – e.g. deployment in urban/sub-urban areas of electric recharging point by 2020
- Targeted financial support, in particular
 - Research and innovation: Horizon 2020 programme CIVITAS Initiative
 - TEN-T policy: Connecting Europe Facility (CEF)
 - Cohesion policy: European Structural and Investments Funds



The 2011 Transport White Paper

"Roadmap to a Single European Transport Area – Towards a competitive and resource efficient transport system" COM/2011/0144

- Target 60% reduction in transport CO₂ emissions by 2050
- Two 'urban' goals
 - Phase out the use of conventionally fuelled cars in cities by 2050 half their use by 2030
 - Towards 'zero emissions' city logistics in major urban centres by 2030

Sets out 40 specific EC actions for 2011 - 2020



Need for a long term 'urban mobility' vision

Encourage cities to develop a long term vision/objectives for urban mobility

e.g.

- Copenhagen, DK carbon neutral by 2025
- Stockholm, SE fossil fuel free by 2050
- Rotterdam, NL 50% CO² reduction by 2025



The Urban Mobility Package

Communication "Together towards competitive and resourceefficient urban mobility"

COM (2013) 913 - 17 December 2013

- Provide a basis for a continued debate about urban mobility: across the EU and in the Member States
- Enable us to tackle urban mobility together
- •To this end, UMP outlines Commission's approach to reinforced EU support for local action on urban mobility (2014-2020 financial programming period)
- •Recommendations for coordinated action on four specific topics:

 logistics, access regulation, ITS and road safety
 - + strong focus on Sustainable Urban Mobility Planning



Horizon 2020 - the R&I programme for 2014-2020

Total budget 80 b€ over seven years

R&I funding focussed on 8 'Societal Challenges'

'Smart, green and integrated transport' (6.3 b€)

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Structural & Investment Funds

2007-2013:

➤ 7,82 billion were allocated to urban transport and the promotion of clean urban transport

➤over EUR 600 million available for investment in cycle infrastructure 2014 - 2020:

development of a sustainable multi-modal mobility is still one of the key challenges for European cities

➤ This is reflected in the architecture of the European Cohesion Policy where urban mobility plays an important role for achieving a shift to a low carbon economy



Trans-European Transport Network

2014-2020:

Financing available for cycle lanes on relevant infrastructure

Synergies with other policies should be exploited, e.g. with tourism by including, within civil engineering structures such as bridges or tunnels, bicycle infrastructure for long-distance cycling paths like the EuroVelo routes.


