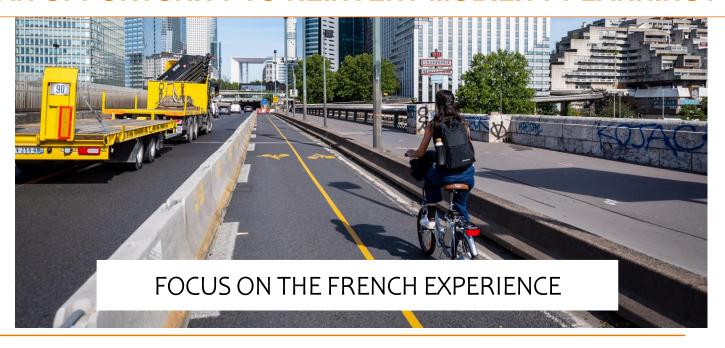

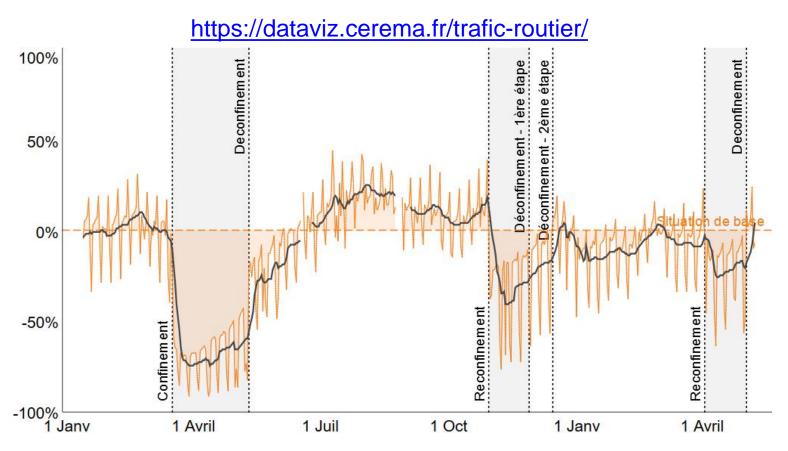

How does pandemic impact road traffic levels (national scale)?

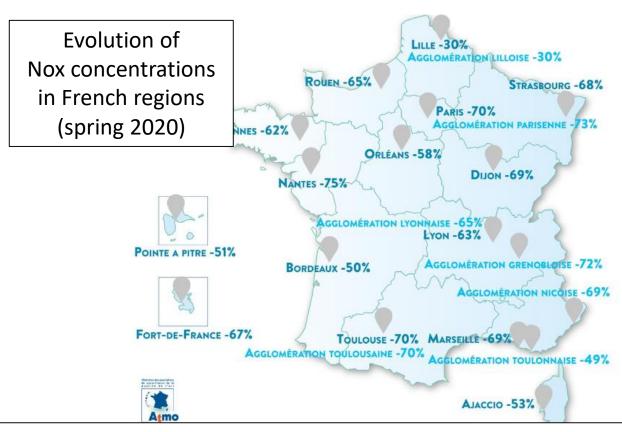






COVID AND LOCKDOWNS:

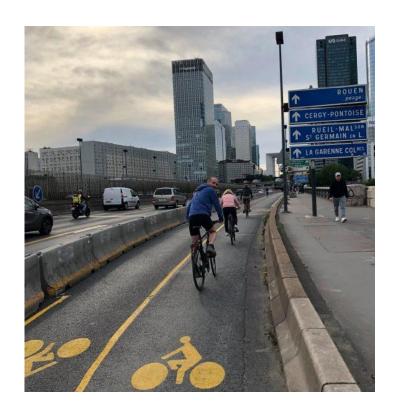

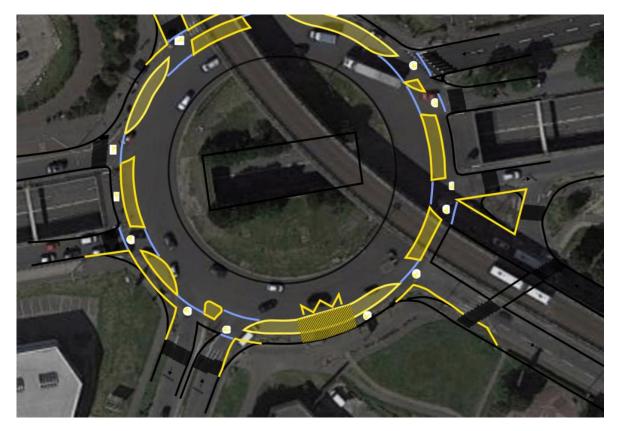

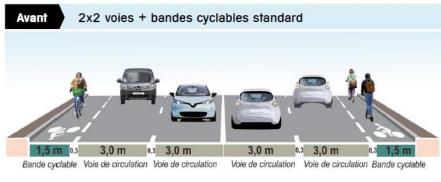

FIRST RESULTS

Biking in France Main figures for 2021 (from 1st of January top 2nd of May) Bicycle traffic + 28 % Weeks + 24 % Week-ends + 41 % Geographical background Cities + 28 % Suburban + 34 % **Rural Areas** + 21 %

* Compared to 2019 figures







LOW COST, REVERSIBLE SOLUTIONS, SERVING AS A TEST TOWARD A NEW MOBILITY PLANNING TOOL?

- More than 1000 km (620 miles) of cycling infrastructures have been planned and more than 600 km (370 miles) are implemented
- Implemented in record time (some projects were stuck for many years), at moderate costs, initially due to pandemic
- A dazzling acceleration of cycling policies, and an overall increase of active modes users, even in rural areas (media impact)
- Infrastructures are flexible, adaptable, reversible, the are life-size development tests, allowing research of new solutions (nearly 10% were removed)
- Many projects are already in perpetuation phase (Government supports some of them)

WHAT TO DO AND WHAT TO AVOID?

Do's

- Have an overview and carry out tests on key locations (high potential: hotspot of an existing network for example)
- Take advantage of the test methodology to try ambitious solutions
- Keep in mind that change is not immediate
- Rely on users to assess new facilities
- Support, communicate and encourage new usages

Don'ts

- Plan temporary infrastructures where it's easy rather than where it's useful
- Avoiding the question of continuity (network aspects)
- Conclude too quickly: changes take time but remain necessary, regarding challenges
